**SUBJECT:** RECEIVE AND FILE CRIMINAL ACTIVITY IN PARKS

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the City Council, by Motion, receive and file an update regarding criminal activity in parks and enforcement data for violations of the Anaheim Municipal Code.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

During the July 17, 2018 City Council meeting, a request was made by Council Member Barnes for an update related to enforcement of Chapter 11 of the Anaheim Municipal Code relating to camping and storage of personal property in public areas along with criminal activity in West Anaheim parks. During the same meeting, Council Member Murray requested the update include information on criminal activity at all impacted parks. In the effort to provide as comprehensive a picture of activity as possible, the information provided herein includes police calls for service; reported crime; Anaheim Municipal Code (AMC) enforcement data and Anaheim Anytime complaints for the time period July 16, 2017 – July 15, 2018 associated with the following parks: Twila Reid, Maxwell, Schweitzer, John Marshall, Peter Marshall, Brookhurst, La Palma, Edison, Pearson and Boysen. Also included are aggregate data from our private security vendor, Lyons pertaining to their activity in parks.

In addition, within the crime section of this report an analysis of crime within a ¼ mile radius around Maxwell Park is provided. This is included since Maxwell Park is currently the most impacted park within the city in terms of homelessness. This analysis includes a year over year comparison.

#### **CALLS FOR SERVICE**

In terms of calls for service, the table below shows the police calls at each park, both resident generated and officer generated. It also depicts those calls which involved homelessness on some level, both in aggregate and as a percentage of the overall calls for service.

**CRIME: Part I and II**

The chart below shows crime in each of the listed parks, broken out by type: Part I and Part II crime. Part I: Also known as “index” crimes, are serious offenses including murder, sexual assault, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, vehicle theft, larceny-theft and arson. These are included in the Uniform Crime Reporting Statistics reported to the Department of Justice (DOJ) not only due to their seriousness but because they are likely to be reported to the police and occur in all parts of the country. Part I offenses are further broken down into violent (murder, sexual assault-rape, aggravated assault, robbery) and property crimes (burglary, vehicle theft, larceny, arson). Part II: All other crimes not listed as Part I are Part II, and include but are not limited to: simple assaults, forgery, fraud, weapons offenses, prostitution, evading police, narcotics violations, DUI. As Part II crimes are not reported to the DOJ, this report will focus solely on Part I crimes. Following the data of crime in the parks, an analysis of crime (Part I & II) within ¼ mile of Maxwell Park over a two-year period is also provided which compares reported crime in the community surrounding the park over the past year to the year prior.
