Subject: Item No. 1 – Discussion of Draft City Council District Boundaries

At the August 19, 2015 Committee meeting, the Committee received public testimony and received and discussed all 25 district boundary draft maps (21 submitted by the public and four (4) draft maps prepared by the demographer, Justin Levitt). The Committee focused on keeping the Colony and Resort Area whole, while maintaining one map splitting the Resort area for discussion purposes. As such, the Committee decided to move forward with the following five plans: Reyes 2, Chuchua 4, Gagne 1, and Consultant drafts 3 and 4. Further, the Committee directed staff to provide a modified version of Chuchua Map 4 and Reyes Map 2 to include two districts that are majority Latino by Citizen Voting Age Population (CVAP); Gagne 1 and Consultant Drafts 3 and 4 have two majority Latino CVAP districts.

The level of public participation at Committee meetings has been positive. To keep with this momentum staff encourages the public to continue to provide testimony on their plan of interest, including testimony on the following specific areas which may assist the Committee in narrowing the maps:

1. What should be the boundaries for the two districts in the far western part of the City, Districts 1 and 2.
2. Whether the Reyes 2 plan and/or Chuchua 4 plan should be modified to include a second Latino CVAP majority district.

It is recommended that the Committee continue to provide staff with direction to further refine district boundary maps.
